



Thank you for getting involved with Splodge Designs and The Novium Museum's story cube project. We are going to be using beads on the cubes and we will label each cube with its beaded title.

Beaded backstitch is one of the most commonly used way of securing the beads onto the fabric. Choose a piece of fabric that you can bead onto.

Decide on your word and use a fabric pencil to trace onto your fabric.

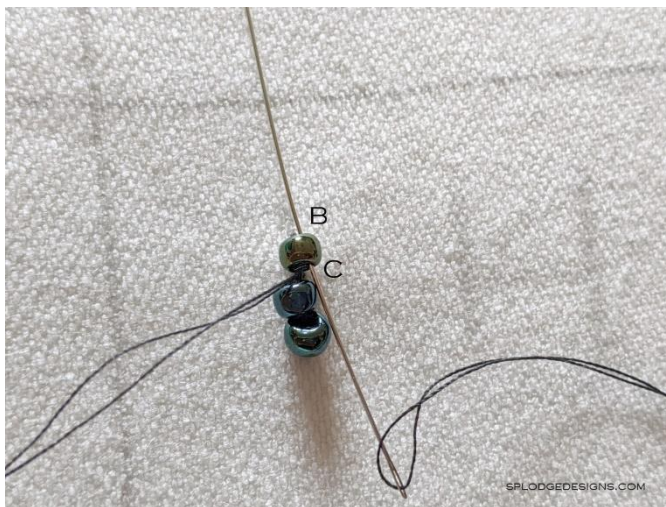


Step 1

Using a beading needle or a needle that will fit through your beads, thread through so that your thread is doubled and knot at the end. Bring up the needle at A, add on three beads and go down at B.

Step 2

Come back up through at C which is one bead back from B.



Step 3

Go back through the third bead out at B and then add on three more beads and then keep repeating for your line of beads.

Further details:

If you need to make a curve, I sometimes add less beads to make it easier. If you need no more beads just go back into the ones you have sewn and secure.
